At a restaurant ... //

Please order food for the number of people in your group at a restaurant (as well as at a ramen shop or sushi bar). If the menu says "minimum order of 2 portions", you can also share the dish with others in your party. At a restaurant serving alcoholic beverages, you can order several dishes and share them all. At this kind of restaurant, "otoshi", a small appetizer served automatically with your first drink, and cover charge (small amount) will be added to the bill.



At a hotel buffet ... Take as much food as you can eat


Many hotels offer buffet-style breakfast or dinner. Take the food items of your choice on your plate and have a seat at a buffet. Use the serving utensils (chopsticks, knife, fork etc.) provided for each item when you help yourself. Take smaller portions and do not fill your plate with lots of food at once. You can return to the buffet station as often as you like. Overloading your plate or taking more food items than processary are considered as had manners. necessary are considered as bad manners



Wait in line!

People may wait in line in front of the entrance of many facilities, fareboxes on buses or ticket gates at train stations to present or insert their ticket. It is said that Japanese people love to wait in line. Actually you will see a very long line of people waiting in front of a popular restaurant or shop. You cannot cut in line instead of waiting in line. People line up




